

Load Containment

Cargo must remain secured on or in a transporting vehicle under all conditions that could reasonably be expected to occur in normal driving, including when a driver is responding in all emergency situations, except when there is a crash. Lumber tarps are used on loads that are tall and box-shaped. They have flaps at each end to cover the ends of lumber. Both the sides and tail flap of a lumber tarp are usually fitted with grommets and multiple rows of D-rings for a variety of tie-down points. Usually, two lumber tarps are used to cover a flatbed load.



- *Protect cargo from weather damage and general wear-and-tear that highway travel can cause*

- *Designed specifically for use on flatbed trailers, where loads must be kept dry and safe during transit*
- *Suited for long, tall loads such as stacked wood, wallboard, and other products that can be damaged by rain, UV rays, or road debris*
